	Patient Assessment: A/ox4, GCS 15,skin warm dry and pink with no uticaria at this time, bottom lip swollen with trouble swallowing, lungs clear bilat with equal chest rise, abdomen soft non tender, pelvis unremarkable, good PMS in all extremities. Pt stated that he did not know why this was happening.
	Treatment of Life Threatening Conditions: Airway was assessed for swelling, lungs for clarity, skin for uticaria, O2 sats WNL
	Reassessment and Management of ABC's: ABC's were assessed the entire time for maintaining normal values.
